EAST DIVISION PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Casey Meador, G, Jr., Louisiana College

Junior guard Casey Meador (Abbeville, La./North Vermillion HS) scored 46 points and tallied seven steals to lead Louisiana College to a 1-1 week, including a conference season-opening 89-80 win at Howard Payne on Saturday (Nov. 27). Meador opened the week with 27 points against NCAA Div. I McNeese State (Nov. 23), then posted a gamehigh 19 points with six rebounds and four steals vs. HPU.

WEST DIVISION PLAYER OF THE WEEK Terence Mirabel, W. Jr., McMurry University

McMurry wing **Terence Mirabel** (Sante Fe, N.M./Capital HS) poured-in a season-high 26 points to lead the Indians to a 99-90 home and conference-opening win vs. UT-Tyler on Saturday (Nov. 27). The junior was a perfect 10-of-10 from the line and nailed 6-of-9 field goals, including four three-pointers, to pace the hot-shooting McMurry offense. Mirabel added five rebounds and two steals.

EAST DIVISION PLAYER OF THE WEEK Habeeb Kareem, C, Fr., University of the Ozarks

Freshman center Habeeb Kareem (Richmond, Texas/George W. Bush HS) averaged 20.5 points and 8.0 rebounds to lead University of the Ozarks to a pair of wins over the first weekend of the 2004-05 season. Kareem scored 21 points and grabbed 13 rebounds in the season-opening win at Hendrix College (Nov. 19) and followed that performance with a 20-point effort in the win against Rhodes College (Nov. 20). Kareem was 18-of-24 (.750) from the floor for the two-game stretch.

WEST DIVISION PLAYER OF THE WEEK Tommy Stolhandske, F, Sr., Texas Lutheran University

Texas Lutheran senior forward **Tommy Stolhandske** (San Antonio, Texas/Churchill HS) scored 38 points and hauled down 18 rebounds, including a double-double performance against No. 17-ranked Wheaton College, for all-tournament honors at the Lee Pfund Classic in Wheaton, Ill. (Nov. 19-20). Stolhandske opened the year with 22 points in the Bulldogs' win against Kalamazoo College and finished with 16 points and 11 rebounds vs. WC, shooting .700 from the field (14-of-20) and committing one personal foul in tournament play.

AROUND THE ASC

Ozarks' Freshman C Habeeb Kareem continues his impressive shooting from the floor after posting a perfect 11-of-11 performance against Concordia-Austin (Nov. 27). Through three games, Kareem is shooting 28-of-33 (.848) from the field and is the Eagles' leading scorer with a 20.7 average. . . . David Hamilton leads Ozarks in rebounding (9.3).

Mary Hardin-Baylor beat Austin College 57-53 in the home opener on Saturday (Nov. 27) to remain unbeaten on the season (3-0). . . . F Jimmy Carter scored a season-high 15 points in the AC win and his late three-pointer provided some insurance in a one-point game.... PG Brandon Gatlin led the Crusaders with a game-high 17 points, six rebounds and four assists. His hot shooting — Gatlin connected on 7-of-8 field goals and three free throws — made the difference as the Crusaders took control of the game late. His only miss from the field came from beyond the three-point line. He added six rebounds and four assists.

With its 99-90 win at home vs. UT-Tyler on Saturday (Nov. 27), McMurry moved to 6-3 all-time in ASC openers and 7-2 in conference home openers. . . . W Terence Mirabal ranked second in NCAA Division II free throw percentage at .903 (56-of-62) last season while playing for New Mexico Highlands. In his first year with the Indians, he is already 20-of-23 from the stripe. . . . C Cole Riggan already has 12 blocks in three games — a block every four minutes — and is on pace to record 100 for the season, which would shatter both the school and ASC records. . . . C Travis Tennison is averaging a doubledouble with 17.7 points and 11.0 rebounds. . . . McMurry is 10-1 in its last 11 games when reaching 90-point plateau.

Louisiana College was one of two ASC East teams to begin conference play with a win, taking an 89-80 win at Howard Payne (Nov. 27). . . . G Casey Meador has been LC's leading scorer in each of the three season-opening games. . . . Against Div. I McNeese State, senior F Chris Campbell didn't miss a shot, going 3-of-3 from the floor and 4-of-4 at the line.

Hardin-Simmons is off to its best start since the 1999 season at 3-1.... Calvin Nite hit a shot at the buzzer to beat Southwestern on Tuesday (Nov. 23). The ACU transfer had seven points in the final two minutes as the Cowboys overcame a 15-point deficit in the final 6:30. . . . F Zach Pickelman has scored in double figures each game and had his first double-double of the season in Saturday's win over UT-Dallas. Pickelman is averaging 14 points and 8.5 rebounds with a 13-of-14 showing at the free throw line.

Mississippi College opened ASC play with a 64-59 loss at Sul Ross State (Nov. 27). It is the Choctaws' second consecutive loss in Alpine, Texas, following a 72-69 loss to SRSU in last season's ASC Championship game. . . . Through two games this year, only three lettermen from last year's ASC East co-champion squad have played for the revamped Choctaws. Jason Walker and Jazsmine Eugene each start with Lance Newlon coming off the bench. . . . G Jazsmine Eugene scored a team high 13 points on 5-of-9 shooting vs. Sul Ross State.

UT-Dallas looked to be getting its ASC schedule off to a good start Saturday on the road against Hardin-Simmons (Nov. 27), building a couple of 10-point leads in the game. But UTD went through an eight-minute stretch late in the second half without scoring a basket from the floor and let HSU catch up, eventually falling 65-59. . . . The Comets have been inconsistent from the field, hitting just .386, but have not been shy about putting up the three-pointers, launching 61 in the first three games. . . . UTD has outrebounded its first three opponents, 34.0-29.7.

AROUND THE ASC

Sul Ross State opened season play with a pair of wins against non-conference foe UT-Permian Basin (86-73, Nov. 23) and last year's ASC East co-champion Mississippi College (64-59). . . . G Sidney Hooper had a combined 40 points in the Lobos' opening week, scoring 31 against UTPB and nine against MC. Hooper was perfect from the free throw line against UTPB (6-of-6) while nailing 7-of-16 shots from three-point range.

East Texas Baptist F Chris Isom averaged 26.0 points and 11.0 rebounds in the season's first two games, including a career-high 35 points and 15 boards in a 118-115 double-overtime loss to NAIA LSU-Shreveport Monday (Nov. 22). Isom scored 17 points with seven rebounds in Saturday's ASC-opening loss at Texas Lutheran. . . . Junior G Cedric Isom averaged 25.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists in the first two games of the season, scoring 24 points in at Texas Lutheran and 26 at LSU-Shreveport. . . . Through the first two games, ETBU's opponents have nearly doubled the Tigers in free throw attempts, with LSU-Shreveport and Texas Lutheran combining to shoot 78 charity shots compared to only 41 for ETBU. . . . The Tigers are on a four-game losing streak dating back to the last home game of the 2003-04 season (Feb. 14 against Austin College).

Texas Lutheran opened ASC play with a 17-point win over East Texas Baptist (Nov. 27). ASC West Preseason Player of the Year P Tommy Stolhandske scored career-best tying 34 points and grabbed seven rebounds, going 12-for-15 from the field and 10-of-14 from the foul line. . . . TLU opened the week with a 69-45 loss at NCAA Div. I UT-San Antonio (Nov. 24) in the first-ever meeting between the schools. Former Bulldog standout Dionne Phelphs is the first assistant with UTSA. . . . TLU has won five consecutive home games dating back to last season...TLU coach Tom Oswald is 52-52 at TLU heading into Monday's game with LeTourneau.

Concordia-Austin won its home opener in an action-packed thriller against Ozarks and gave first year head coach Stan Bonewitz his first collegiate victory. . . . G Keith Darden had a stellar home opening performance on Saturday (Nov. 27) as CUA defeated Ozarks, 100-91, in an action-packed game that saw seven ties and eight lead changes. Darden scored 32 points, grabbed eight rebounds and handed-out four assists over 31 minutes.
